This is the 31st year of the GEOBEE for students in grades 4-8 sponsored by National Geographic. Thousands of schools from the United States, the five U.S. Territories as well as Department of Defense Dependents Schools will compete in this annual contest.

The Heritage Academy Mesa Campus GeoBee champion will advance to the next level of competition, a qualifying test to determine state competitors. Up to 100 of the top test scorers in each state become eligible to compete in their State GeoBee. The winners of the State GeoBees receive an all-expenses-paid trip to National Geographic Society headquarters in Washington, D.C., next May to participate in the GeoBee national championship, competing for cash prizes, scholarships and an all-expenses paid Lindblad expedition to the Galapagos Islands aboard the National Geographic Endeavor II.
